About The PMUA...

The PMUA is both a service and regulatory agency responsible for sanitary sewer collection and treatment services, as well as solid waste collection and disposal operations throughout the City.

The PMUA administers monitors and is responsible for developing, implementing and enforcing rules and regulations concerning the City of Plainfield's entire waste flow in compliance with City, County and State rules and regulations.

The Authority operates and maintains 110 miles of sanitary sewer services lines and two sewerage pumping stations which provides for proper collection of municipal waste water.

Comprehensive solid waste services are provided for single and multi-family residential units which include scheduled collection of household garbage and recyclables.

Bulky Waste Service

As of 2011, collection of Bulky Waste under the Shared Services program entities each property location in Plainfield to two Bulk Waste collections per calendar year.
